Lobbyist Registration Frequently Asked Questions

Q) Who qualifies as a lobbyist?

A) Anyone who spends more than 30 hours in any consecutive three-month period, with at least one direct communication with a City official or employee, for the purpose of attempting to influence municipal legislation on behalf of any other person.

Q) Are there exceptions to this?

A) Yes. Anyone who is not paid, but just volunteers time for a cause is not required to register. Also, any public official does not have to register.

Q) What does it mean to register?

A) A lobbyist must annually register with the City Controller and provide details of the company that they work for and the clients they represent.

Q) Does it cost anything to register?

A) Yes, there is an annual registration fee of \$100. The City Controller will ONLY accept a check or money order as a form of payment. All checks and money orders should be made out to "Treasurer, City of Pittsburgh."

Q) What is the punishment for failing to register?

A) A person who knowingly violates this law can receive civil penalties of up to \$2,000. If the court determines that a violation was intentional, the court may order that the defendant be prohibited from acting as a lobbyist.

Q) How does this registration handle nonprofits?

A) People representing non-profits that receive public funds to serve indigent persons are not required to register.
